

SERVICES

UCP DAY PROGRAMS

UCP offers center/community-based Adult Day programs in Modesto and Turlock, where participants work on personalized goals and objectives to meet their needs. The program focuses on skill building in the areas of self-advocacy, independent living skills and pre-employment skills. Other areas of training include communication, physical education, cooking, technology, and social skills.

Expanding Horizons is our community integration program that focuses on promoting independence, becoming a self-advocate and pre-employment skills. This program allows participants to be active participants of the community in which they live. Each day the participants work to build skills in areas such as independence and self-sufficiency, personal safety, mobility training, self-advocacy, vocational skills and exploration, communication, and use of community resources. Participants of this program participate in community service activities, attend social outings, participate in a recycling program, maintain a community garden and stay healthy by participating in various recreational activities.

ALSO OFFERED

Aktion Club/ Buddy Club

Aktion Club is the only service club for adults with disabilities, with more than 12,000 members worldwide. UCP, in partnership with Society for Disabilities, Kiwanis of Greater Turlock and Kiwanis of North Modesto has started a local chapter. Aktion Club gives the individuals we serve an opportunity to serve their community and form valuable friendships. We meet every other month.

Spark an Imagination Reading Club

Reading Club is a partnership with Special Needs in My City that meets weekly to read books together. Think book club and social hour. It was developed out of need for socialization during the pandemic but has continued to be a great way to spark imaginations through reading.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

UCP is committed to an excellence in service utilizing a person-centered approach in the areas of job placement, development, and implementation.

In partnership with the Department of Rehabilitation and Valley-Mountain Regional Center, UCP offers the following services to individuals seeking employment:

- External Situational Assessment
- Job Placement
- Job Coaching
- Job Development
- Internship Programs

TAILORED DAY SERVICES

UCP's employment focused Tailored Day Services (TDS) are designed to help the individual focus on their individual goal(s) and on their own timeline. It is a one-on-one, hourly service that can take place once a week or more than once a week and is designed based on the individual's interests and goals. For those that are interested in UCP's Paid Internship Program (PIP), signing up for TDS is a requirement (if the person is not already in another Day program and is case by case) that will help prepare them for the workplace. UCP uses an extensive curriculum designed to help participants prepare for the workplace. The curriculum touches on topics such as body language, conflict resolution in the workplace, taking initiative, dressing for success and many other useful and vital work readiness topics. TDS also allows for things such as job exploration, studying for a Driver's License written test and help with studying for (some) higher education classes. The list of possibilities is based on what the individual is interested in.

Camp UCP

Camp UCP is a fun filled week in the beautiful Sierra Nevada Mountains, where campers participate in fun summer camp activities with friends.

UCP attends Tuolumne Trails Camp each year with 40 campers. While camp provides camp staff, UCP provides a staff member for each cabin that works with the campers during the year and knows their needs.

We are more than our name at UCP. UCP is one of the nation's leading organizations serving and advocating for the more than 160,000 children and adults with disabilities. Today more than 65% of children and adults served by UCP Nationwide have disabilities other than cerebral palsy.

Katrina Pamittan's journey is a powerful example of how employment can open doors to independence, confidence, and community connection. Through determination, hard work, and the right supports, Katrina has transformed opportunity into lasting growth and continues to shine every day on the job.

After completing a nine-month Culinary Course at The Institute of Technology, Katrina took her first step into the workforce through UCP Stanislaus' Paid Internship Program. She began working at The Ice Cream Co., a nonprofit ice cream shop in Modesto that provides job training for individuals with disabilities. Katrina approached the role with dedication and reliability, commuting daily from Patterson to Modesto to gain valuable work experience. Over time, however, the transportation demands became challenging for her family.

In collaboration with UCP Stanislaus, Katrina was able to transition to Manny's Touchdown Pizza & Grill in Patterson in September 2025 a move that proved to be a perfect fit. Since then, Katrina has continued to grow professionally, learning new job skills and strengthening her customer service abilities with the support of a UCP Stanislaus Job Coach.

Under the guidance and mentorship of Manny Ramirez and with consistent support from her job coach, Katrina is empowered to succeed while building independence on the job. Once shy and reserved, she now greets guests with a welcoming smile and cheerful confidence. Her confidence has grown substantially, and she takes pride in contributing to her workplace.






Liabilities & Net Assets






